UC Education Abroad Program (EAP)

Ranked as one of the top international study programs in the nation, EAP offers language and culture programs as well as full immersion programs by partnering with leading universities around the world. EAP offers 200 programs in 35 countries. Students can study abroad for an entire academic year or for a semester/quarter length of time. UC Sacramento Center

Students of all majors who are interested in gaining valuable hands-on work experience in our state capitol can do so at the UC Sacramento Center. UCLA Summer Sessions Travel Study

Every summer, students have an opportunity to participate in a travel study program that allows them to earn academic credit while exploring a dynamic subject immersed in the relevant culture and environment. From NYC or Washington, DC to Europe, Asia, or Latin America, students are taught by distinguished UCLA faculty and interact with notable experts in the field of study. Students can choose from over 30 programs on five different continents, varying from four to six weeks in length. UCLA Center for American Politics and Public Policy (CAPPP)

This program is available for students to study, intern, and live in Washington, DC for one academic quarter.
